



## Long-term Strategies

Listed in descending order of popularity

- **Capacity-building/Funding** (L1, 76 dots)
  - Tax incentives for conservation easements
  - User fees for recreation access
  - Increase boater/off-road vehicle fees
  - Tax credits
  - Hotel, recycle, gas taxes
  - Impact fees for developers
  
- **Education** (L3, 64 dots)
  - What has development done to your community? Inspire involvement.
  - K-12 → stewardship; connections to land and wildlife
  - Urban education → resource-based jobs = stewardship; benefits of working landscape (farms, forests, and ranches)
  
- **Technical Assistance** (L2, 57 dots)

Provide technical assistance to local governments on land use planning in form of workshops or training for local Planning & Zoning → to broaden leadership.
  
- **Promote Sustainability!** (L7, 28 dots)

What you can do...

  - Local foods
  - Recycle
  - Plant trees/gardens
  - Alternative energy
  - Community grants
  
- **Clearinghouse** (L6, 27 dots)

Develop a clearinghouse for information exchange regarding funding, programs, and services (e.g., Idaho One Plan, Ag Extension). Could take form of website, workshops, networking, etc.
  
- **Collaborative Efforts** (L5, 12 dots)

Move from short-term to long-term collaborative efforts. For example, use the Cooperative Weed Management Area model at the watershed scale; address comprehensive planning issues.



- **Business Diversification/Diverse Farm Economy** (L4, 10 dots)
  - Windfarms, ecotourism
  - Organic farms
  - Develop markets to help profitability (e.g., wolf-friendly beef)
